This comic book is based on a true story, but we could have based it on a thousand different stories to end in the same ending: a family story of collective and individual pain.

From CEMIN and GINSO we want to bring to light these social situations, which are usually suffered in a private space, in order to make our society aware of the need to develop preventive policies that avoid these situations, which are becoming more and more common.

As a subjective right of citizenship, socio-educational and therapeutic programs of family intervention are required intervention that, from the community framework, accompany families throughout their life cycle. We believe that public authorities should reinforce the network of specialized resources in the field of child and adolescent mental health. Multipurpose services within the health system and linked to other public systems, which help adolescents and their adult referents to face these trances when they occur.

In this story, Iker was diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), but it is clear to us that it is possible to reach this situation without having this pathology. In fact, most adolescents, with or without ADHD are not violent towards their parents and families.

The phenomenon of domestic violence responds to a multi-causal reality in which concomitantly interact with elements of diverse nature such as: educational models of upbringing, relational patterns of the members of the family system, anomie, psychopathologies, problematic use of drugs...

We also want to make it clear that the scene that takes place in this comic with the members of the Security Forces of the State responds to a conjunctural and punctual situation in which these agents do not give due importance to IKER's behavior. But we know that, usually, they do because we very prepared professionals. It is our intention to call the attention and to ask all the people and professionals who intervene in these situations, to make one more effort and to maximize their empathy, professionalism, training, and attention to the families who live this phenomenon of domestic violence.

In this case, the father was not able at first to grasp the problem in its full dimension and it was the mother who struggled to provide solutions, but the opposite could have been the case. As is often the case in the day-to-day life of all families, with different sensitivities, training and preparation, parents must deal with any family problems or controversies that arise.

As we pointed out at the beginning, it is particularly difficult to reflect in a comic book the casuistry and in deep dimensions. It is only a comic book and space is limited. Precisely because of that limitation, we would like in the next editions to be able to go through the alternatives that are offered to respond to lker's needs and those of his family environment, as well as a glimpse of how the therapeutic centers work.

Finally, we want to make it clear that it is not our intention, in those cases in which there is child-parental violence, to blame anyone, that is to say, neither the parents, nor the sons and daughters, nor the relatives, friends, etc., for the violence. It is impossible for therapists to work with blame. We simply want to put on record a problem, which is becoming more and more common, that needs to be made visible, treated and try to solve it.

































































